FFA CREED SPEAKING

Purpose

The purpose of the FFA Creed Speaking Leadership Development Event is to develop the ability of beginning FFA members to demonstrate their interpretation and self-expression of the FFA Creed.

Objectives

The student will be able to:

- I. Memorize and recite the FFA Creed.
- II. Present the FFA Creed using his/her own interpretation, self-expression, and delivery.
- III. Experience speaking before a group.
- IV. Communicate effectively with others.
- V. Develop self-confidence in speaking before an audience.

Event Format

- This event is limited to FFA members in good standing who are enrolled in the agriculture program for the first time and who are either in the ninth or tenth grade. Only students who are in the 9th grade at the time of the state event will be allowed to compete in the National event. (See National LDE rules)
- 2. Participants will be asked questions directly related to the FFA Creed following their presentation. A maximum of two (2) minutes will be allowed for questions per participant. At the end of two (2) minutes the time keeper will call time and the participant must stop even if they are in the middle of answering a question. The two (2) minute time will begin when the judge begins their first question. Questions will be formulated by the event judges and two part questions will be avoided. During the state event questions will change (be different) between the 1st round and the finals. Sample questions <u>will not</u> be available prior to the event.
- 3. Students are <u>not</u> allowed to compete in FFA Creed Speaking and Division I Prepared Public Speaking the same year.

Event Format

- 4. Each contestant must recite the FFA Creed from memory. An introduction to the creed may be given; however it is limited to exactly the following words "The FFA Creed by E. M. Tiffany". If the short introduction is given, any words added &/or deleted may be subject to the 10 point per word penalty. No closing information should be presented with the exception of exactly the words, "Thank You.". <u>DO NOT</u> present the statement at the end of the FFA Creed regarding when The FFA Creed was adopted & revised. Doing so will result in a 10 point per word penalty.
- 5. No closing statement or comments are permitted.
- 6. The presentation will be given without the use of a microphone.
- 7. The time limit is four minutes for presenting the FFA Creed. Time deduction of one (1) point per second over time.
- 8. The number of state FFA Creed speaking entries from each district is listed in the Guidelines under Allocation of Teams from Each District. <u>Each school will be allowed two Creed</u> <u>speakers at the Area LDE. ALL contestants are eligible to advance to the next level of</u> <u>competition (i.e. 2 contestants from the same school may advance). This will not change the number of students qualifying for District or State competition.</u>
- 9. Ten (10) points shall be deducted for each added or deleted word. A Reader other than the judge will be used to check the wording and determine mistakes
- 10. Only creed speaking participants and contest officials will be allowed in the holding room.

Event Scoring

- 1. The timekeeper will record and present to each judge the contestant's time. The timekeepers' record will be used in computing the final score for each contestant.
- 2. Each judge will total the score for each contestant.
- 3. Contestants shall be ranked in numerical order on the basis of final score by each judge without consultation with any other judge.
- 4. The judges' score sheets will be submitted to the contest officials to determine final ratings of contestants.
- 5. The judges ranking for each contestant shall be added together.
- 6. The winner will be the contestant whose total of the judges' ranking is the lowest.
- 7. Refer to General LDE guidelines for additional rules and policies.
