Safety Guidelines & Protocol *(approved by University of Missouri Incident Command)*

- The CDEs will be conducted at 50% of the normal number of students or less, depending on the venue. Students in each event will be further divided into small groups that will complete the event separately and distanced from the other participating groups.
- Participants must wear face coverings (masks) at all times. Failure to do so results in immediate disqualification. NO gator masks or bandannas will be allowed.
- All participants will adhere to entering and exiting buildings as marked on the maps.
- CDEs will be conducted in socially distanced, learning environments based on established CDC guidelines and capacities. To date, NO transmission of COVID-19 has been directly traced to these environments.
- Due to space capacities, only participants are allowed in the contest facilities.
- Participants will be escorted in small groups from classrooms or arena seating (holding areas) to the skill events. Event staff will lead groups and ensure social distancing.
- All skills will be planned and conducted with six foot spacing between each student.
- For the two events requiring travel (Horse Evaluation and Soils), transportation will be provided by the respective school district.
- In selected events involving judges who interact with participants (e.g., Ag Sales), judges will Zoom remotely with contestants who will be assigned one per room. Rooms will be sanitized following each engagement.
- Students should bring a filled water bottle as water fountains in the buildings are current disconnected. Students may bring snacks to eat while seated in a holding area.
- If an exposure is traced back to an event, the State Department of Elementary and Secondary Education will have contact information for all schools and participants by event.
- Events will follow the state CDE guidelines as closely as possible. CDE coordinators will notify instructors of any major changes prior to the event.

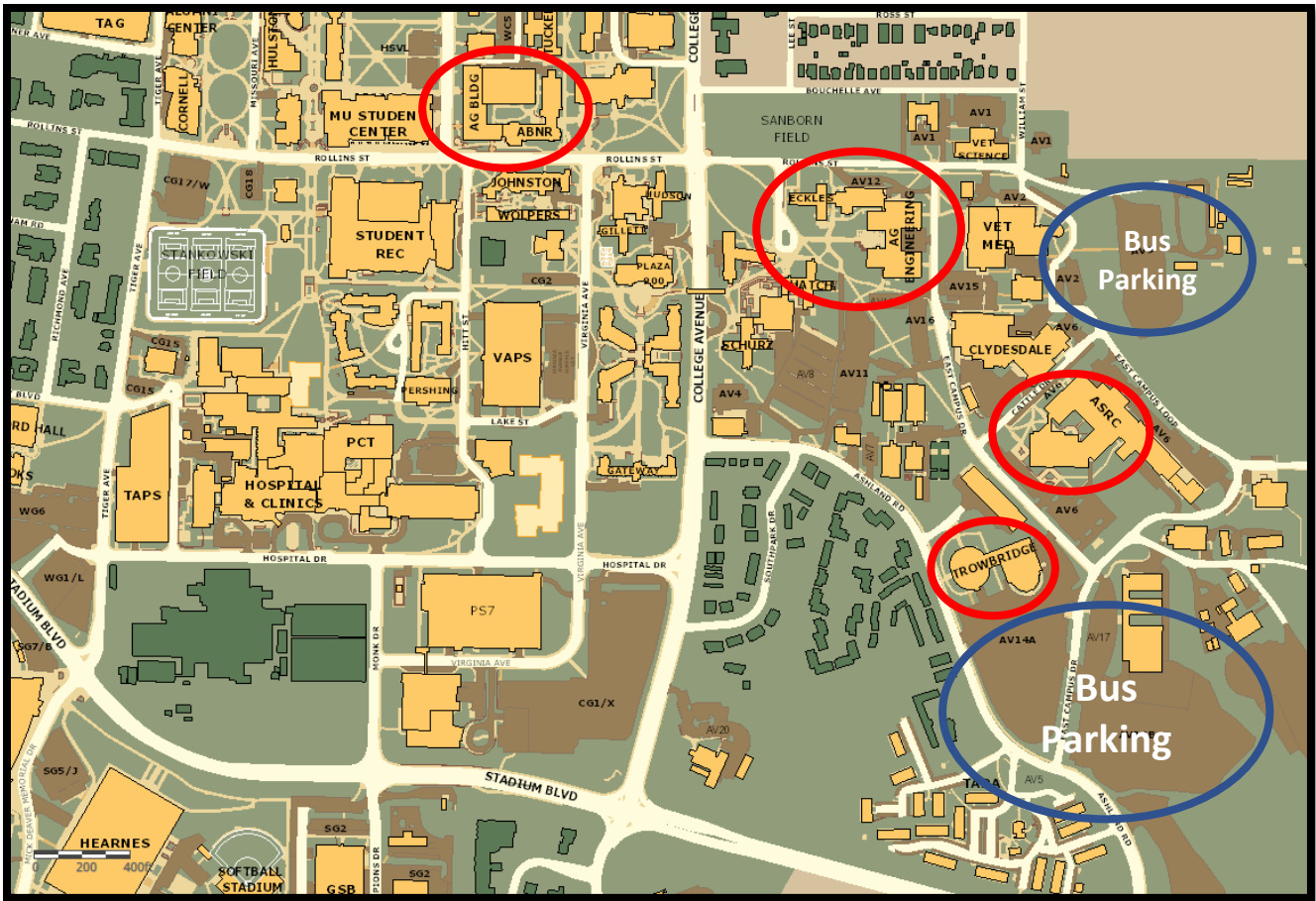


Figure 1. Campus Map

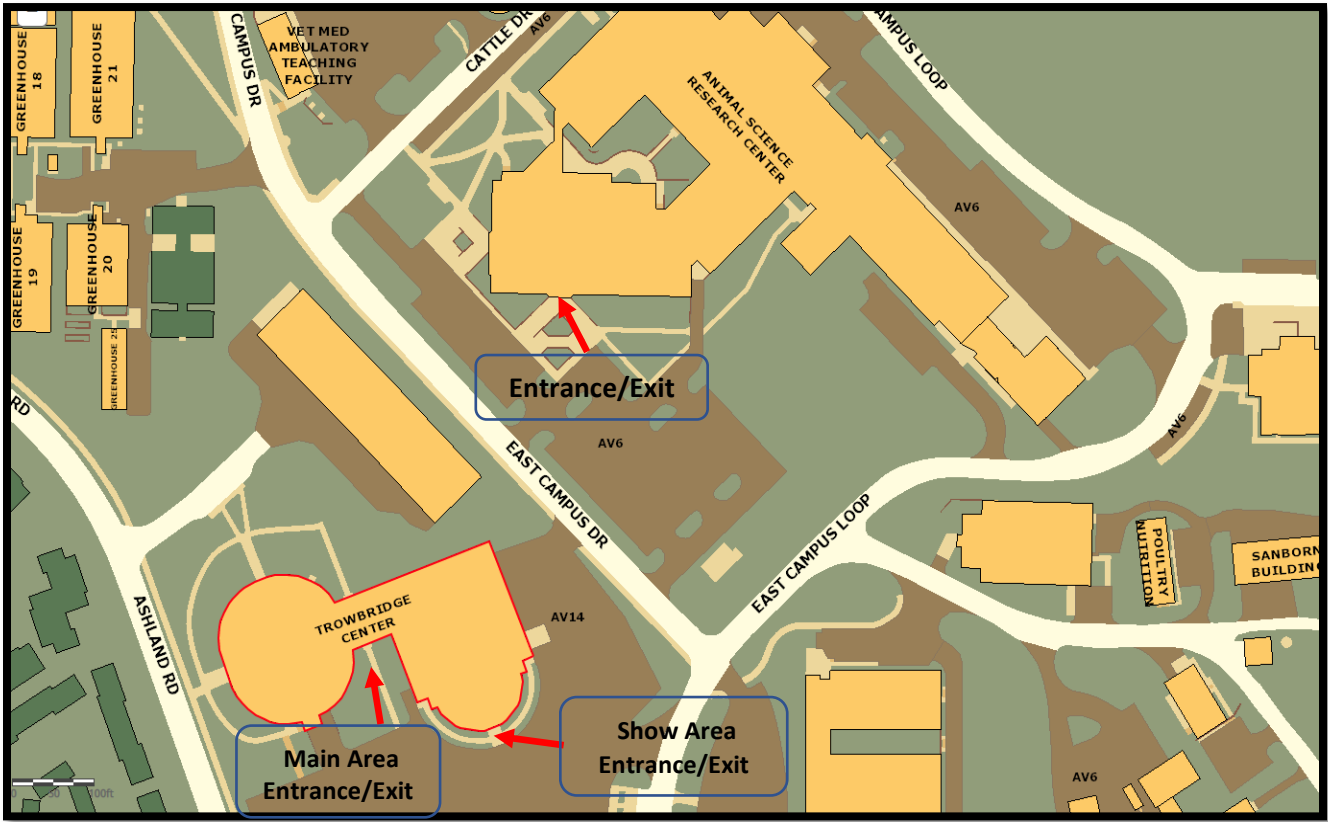


Figure 2. Trowbridge Center & Animal Sciences Research Center

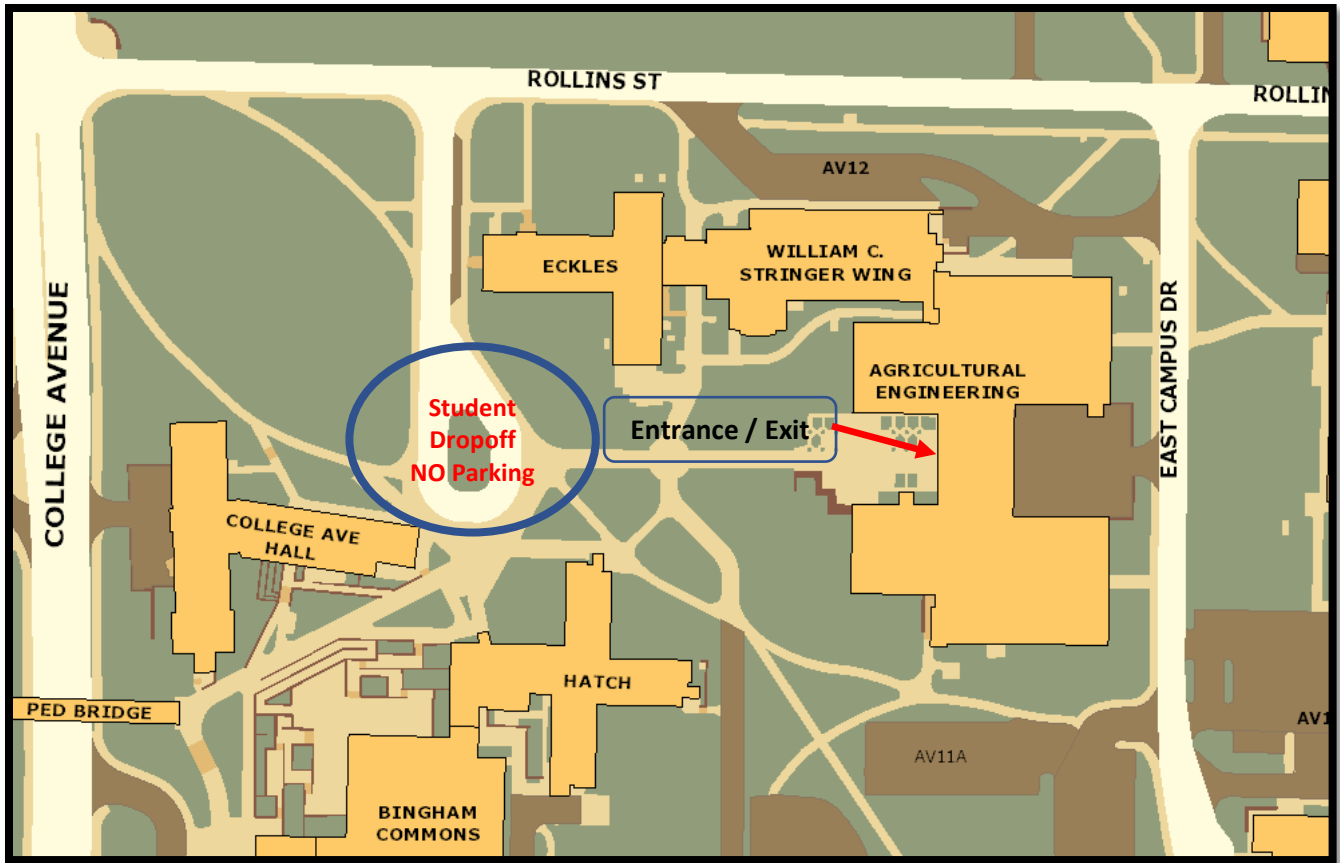


Figure 3. Ag Engineering Bldg.

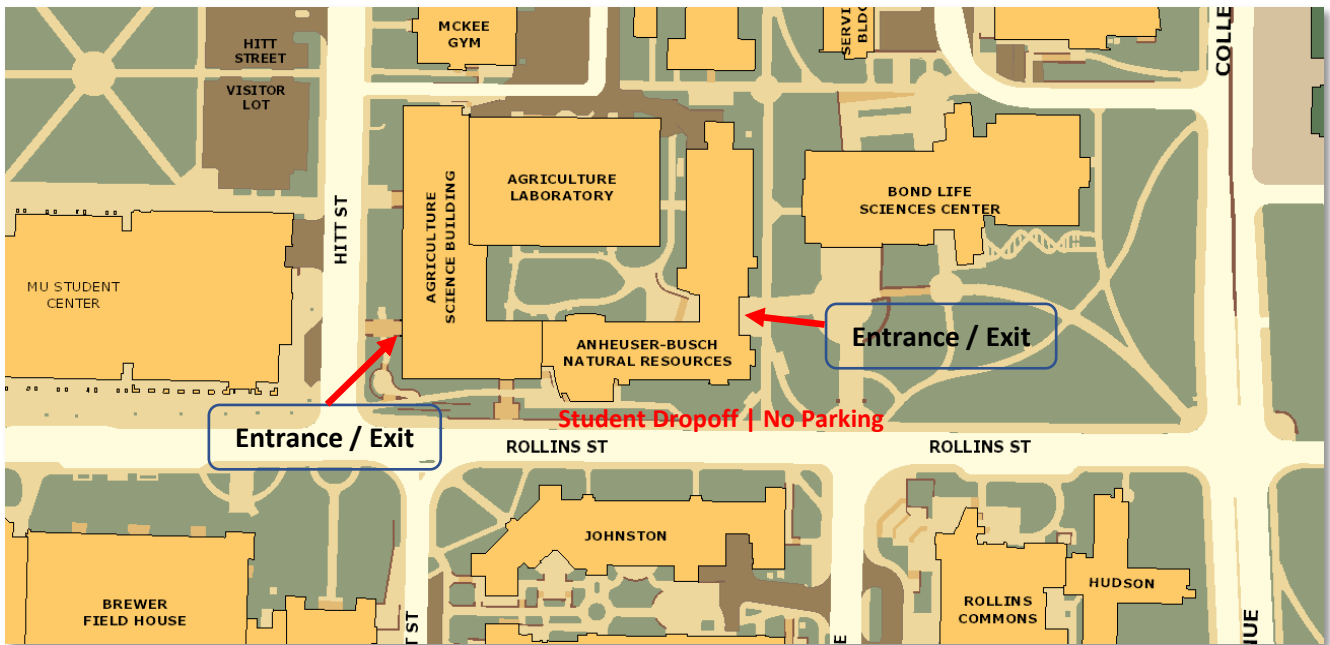


Figure 4. Agriculture Science Bldg. & Anheuser-Busch Natural Resources (ABNR)

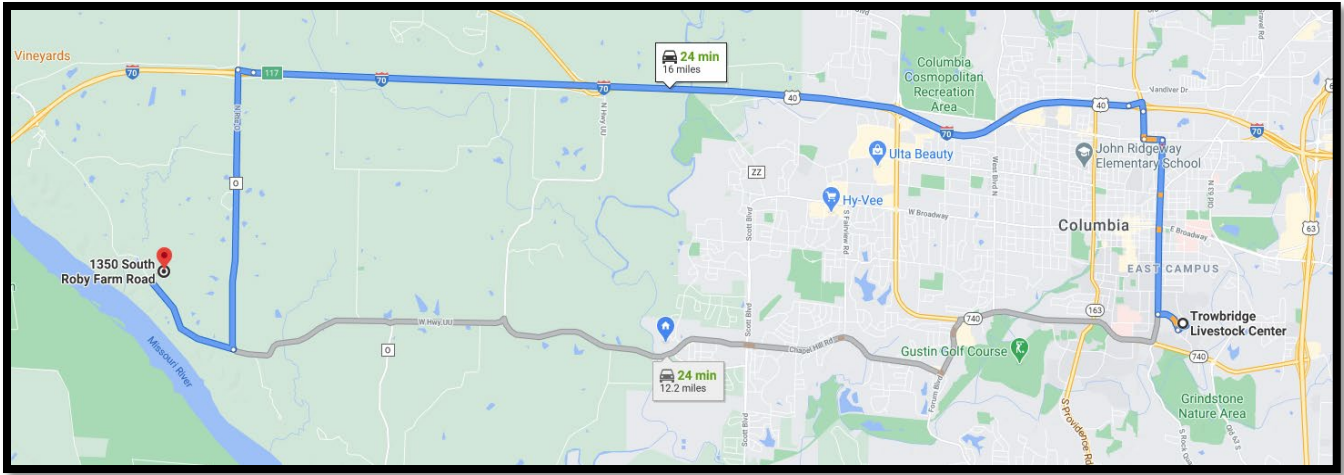


Figure 5. Stephens Equestrian Facility, 1350 S Roby Farm Rd, Rocheport (24 min., 12.2 miles from the Trowbridge Center)
