

Visitor Farm Entry

1. All non-company visitors will be entered in the SPG database.
Large groups will be entered as a group with the list of tour participants' last hog contact.
2. All non-company/non-farm vehicles and equipment must be clean (inside and out) prior to entering farm property.

Pig contact

1. Pig contact is defined as:
 - a. Visiting any swine property.
 - b. Visiting a fair, circus, livestock show, zoo, petting zoo, or any location known to have livestock even if live pigs are not seen.
 - c. Visiting a rendering or meat processing/packing plant (including the office area).
 - d. Visiting a trailer sanitation or a livestock transfer station.
 - e. Travel to a foreign country or anywhere outside the US.
 - f. Any other situations that result in exposure to live or dead swine, swine diagnostic labs, swine excrement, swine semen, butchering facilities, or equipment used in live swine operations.
 - g. Cohabiting, residing with, or staying with an individual (even for one night) who has pig contact
 - h. labs, swine excrement, swine semen, butchering facilities, or equipment used in live swine operations.

(If there are hogs at the NCMC farm, participants will be required to have three nights down and not wear footwear that was worn choring)
